In November 1989, the wheels were in motion to finally unite all the services onto one campus. Dr. Sohn was a member of the church board and told newspapers that officials decided It was time to sell the old school building, the parsonage and the church building on the block of Highland between Faxon and Tutwiler. The asking price was \$650,000. Services were held on both campuses until the Highland property sold. While the property was on the market, plans for the size and design of the new sanctuary and offices were being finalized in order to begin construction as soon as the property sold. At the same time, 5 more acres were being purchased next to the school on Raleigh-LaGrange at the purchase price of \$191,250.

It was nearly 10 years that services were held at both locations. Demographics proved to be a deciding factor in the move to consolidate. At the time about 70% of the members lived out the Interstate 240 loop and most lived close to the Raleigh-LaGrange property.
